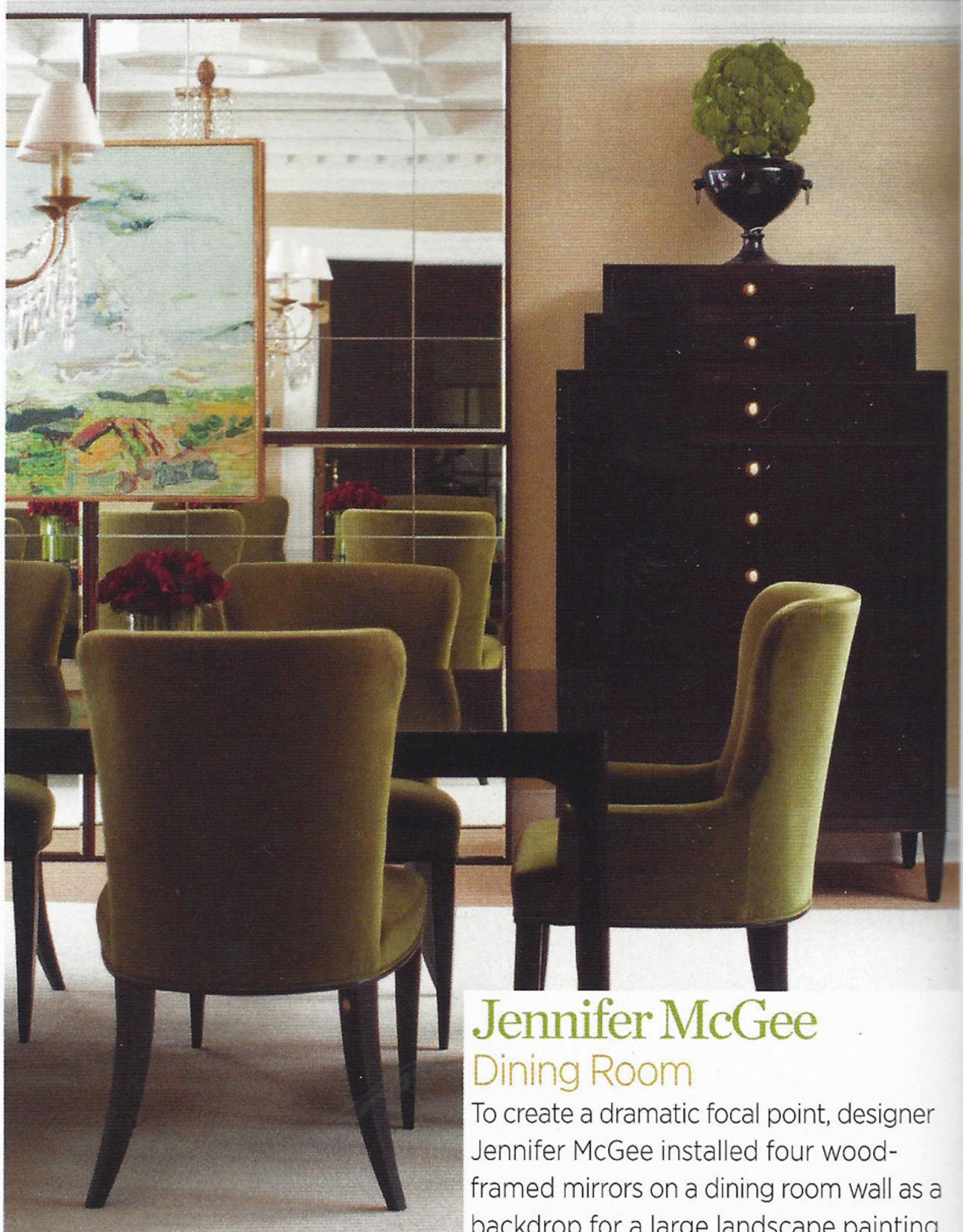






**Anna Maria Mannarino**  
Morning Room

To create a dramatic focal point, designer Jennifer McGee installed four wood-framed mirrors on a dining room wall as a backdrop for a large landscape painting. The designer's "love of nature as well as neutral and textured elements" influenced the green-velvet upholstery and the metallic grass-cloth wallcovering. Philip La Bossiere's lavish-but-comfortable living room embraces texture.
